FAMILY CAMP SCHEDULE OF EVENTS

SATURDAY, MAY 12, 2007

9:00 A.M. Meet at Grace Lutheran Church (or go directly to Camp Tahuaya)

9:15 A.M. Depart for Camp Tahuaya

DIRECTIONS TO CAMP:

Take Hwy 190 east to the Loop 121/Bell County Expo

exit. Turn right and follow the loop south. Get on I-35

heading south towards Salado. Take exit **289A**, the **Tahuaya Road** exit. Keep right, going west for 1 mile on Tahuaya Road to camp entrance gate. Pull into the parking lot on the left, go down the dirt road that goes to the left of the pool house. Tonkawa is the first campsite on the left. Please unload your gear and take your vehicle back out to the parking lot (go back out the way you came and cross the paved road where you turned left to come to camp.) Please set up your tent AFTER you park. Space is limited at the campsite.

- 9:30 A.M. Arrive at campsite (Tonkawa); set up tents and equipment
- 10:45 A.M. Raise US flag with ceremony Welcome & ground rules
- 11:00 A.M. Hike
- 12:30 P.M. Boys and adult partners prepare and eat lunch (bring your own lunch) Free time
- 1:30 P.M. Astronomy Belt Loop activities
- 2:30 P.M. Activity #3 (To Be Announced)
- 3:30 P.M. Activity #4 (To Be Announced)
- 4:00 P.M. Build cooking fire and prepare dinner
- 5:30 P.M. Clean up
- 6:00 P.M. Free time
- 6:30 P.M. Lower U.S. flag with ceremony
- 6:45 P.M. Prepare for campfire (Change into Scout uniform.)
- 7:00 P.M. Awards/campfire program
- 8:30 P.M. S'mores/Astronomy activities (telescopes)
- 10:00 P.M. Quiet time/Lights out

SUNDAY, MAY 13, 2007

- 7:30 A.M. Air bedding; clean up campsite
- 8:00 A.M. Prepare and eat breakfast
- 9:15 A.M. Clean up (Change into Scout uniform.)
- 9:30 A.M. Scout's Own Service
- 10:00 A.M. Strike camp (tent tear-down), leaving camp in better condition than you found it (Police call, load up)
- 12:00 P.M. Clear camp/Go home

Although activities are planned, this is **family camping** so your participation is optional. The idea of family camping is so families spend some time together enjoying the outdoors. This is a basic outline and the scheduling is subject to change. If activities end early, feel free to take advantage of the time to do whatever your family would like. On the other hand, please don't be upset if some activities run slightly longer than planned. Please be flexible. If you choose to participate in fishing, adults must have a fishing license to cast a line. A license is not required for the Scouts. This should be a safe, fun time for all!

PACK 207 FAMILY CAMP RULES

The Scout Oath and Law are applicable at all times in Scout Camp and we have a few other guidelines for your safety.

- No climbing trees or on wooden pallets (which are sometimes stacked in camp to be used as tent floorboards).
- No running in camp.
- Closed-toe shoes are required at all times. (No sandals, flip-flops, etc.)
- No food in tents.
- No going inside the fire ring at any time.
- Bicycles are not permitted at Family Camp due to the environmental impact on the trails and hillsides. Please leave them at home and enjoy walking and hiking.
- Boys may have other boys as "tent mates."
- Only the parents of a child may sleep in the same tent with them. Adults may not be in the same tent with children who are not their own.
- Personal firearms and archery items should be left at home.
- Class I Medical forms must be turned into the den leader prior to camp.

SMOKING AND TOBACCO USE POLICY ON COUNCIL CAMP PROPERTIES

Scouting leaders are instructed not to allow smoking or the use of tobacco by youth at unit meetings and activities. Adult leaders should set the example by not smoking or using tobacco at Scouting activities also (see The Scoutmaster Handbook, page 131). To promote Scouting's aim of physical fitness among its participants as well as to insure the protection and safe use of Council properties, Pack 207 announces the following policy concerning smoking and the use of tobacco at Council camps.

- 1. Smoking or the use of tobacco by any adult leader in the presence of youth is strongly discouraged.
- 2. Smoking or the use of tobacco will not be permitted inside of any building.
- 3. Smoking or the use of tobacco is not permitted in campsites and must be out of the sight of youth.

DRUG, ALCOHOL, USE AND ABUSE

"The Boy Scouts of America prohibits the use of alcoholic beverages and controlled substances at encampments or activities on property owned and/or operated by the Boy Scouts of America, or at any activity involving participation of youth members."
